# Partnering to keep our rural communities resilient and thriving

- Worm farms, vegetable gardens, tree planting or cleaning a local space.
- Dairy products for community fundraising e.g. school playground's, amateur sports, community celebrations

#### The fund will support:

- Registered charity or not for profit or a school or group
- Initiatives that have a wide impact on large groups or communities
- Donations of dairy products
- Cash funding up to the value of \$5K

#### **Initiatives ineligible for funding:**

- Projects that support meeting regulatory requirements or consent conditions
- Individuals or businesses for private gain
- Scholarship funding
- We prefer to support sports clubs through dairy product however where fundraising isn't possible, a cash donation or equivalent value will be considered
- Any individual sports person
- Overseas travel and accommodation



#### **South Waikato supporting Kura Kai**

Earlier this year, volunteers from Te Aroha college, Fonterra and Ngāti Tumutumu Trust gathered at Tui Pā marae for a community cooking session. Their tasty creations, which included Mac and Cheese and Cottage Pie, were then frozen and distributed to the local community.

The event organised by our South Waikato committee team to support Kura Kai, a registered charity who raise funds to purchase chest freezers, which are then donated to the High Schools they support. Kura Kai then works alongside the school to build a local community of volunteers to cook nutritious family meals to help keep those freezers well stocked.



#### Waikato supports Te Awamutu primary school


Our Waikato team provided funding and volunteering supported to Trees for survival, planting 792 native plants in 2022. Trees for Survival is a charitable trust which works with schools across New Zealand to grow and plant native trees. The education programme provides an opportunity for school children to make a practical different to their environment as well as learn about conservation, revegetation, wetland restoration and protecting stream quality.



#### **Central Districts supports Surfing for farmers**

Surfing for farmers is an initiative that is helping improve mental health and wellbeing in rural communities. It was originally launched in Gisborne to provide farmers an opportunity to step away from what can be an all-consuming business, get fresh air, exercise and connect with other rural families. Central Districts have been providing funding support at the Foxton location and organizing the BBQ food for the events.
